When we discover something that nourishes our souls, and with it brings us peace, love, and hope, lets open our hearts and make room for it; let's make room for Christ in our lives.

# Lesley's Hot Cross Buns

- cups (1#) mixed dried fruit (eg raisins, cranberries, chopped apricots, currants)
- 1 tsp sugar
- 2 tsp yeast
- water
- 6 cups all purpose flour
- 2 tsp salt
- 2 eggs
- 3 Tbsp honey
- 1/4 cup butter

# Spice Mixture:

- 1 Tbsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp nutmeg
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp ginger
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp cloves
- Glaze:

3 Tbsp honey, 1 Tbsp butter, ½ tsp cinnamon

# **Directions:**

- 1. Steam dried fruit in boiling water to soften (set aside fruity water)
- 2. In ½ c warm water, dissolve sugar and yeast. Sit until fluffy.
- 3. Combine flour and salt in large mixing bowl, making a well in the centre.
- 4. In separate bowl, combine fruity water with warm water to make 2 cups total, add honey.
- 5. Slightly beat eggs, setting aside 3 Tbsp for egg wash. Add eggs to water/honey mixture.
- 6. Pour water/honey/eggs and yeast mixture into the flour bowl and stir vigorously. Keep your hands wet as you knead the stiff, sticky dough, adding enough water to make the dough silky and elastic.
- 7. Smear butter on work surface and knead until incorporated.
- 8. Add rehydrated fruit one handful at a time.
- 9. Form the dough into a ball, placing it smooth side up in the bowl.

10. Cover, let rise in a warm location until doubled in size (at least 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  hours). Poke the centre of the dough  $\frac{1}{2}$ " deep with your finger; if it doesn't fill in, it is ready to deflate. Re-form into ball, rise again until doubled (approx. half the time).

11. While the dough is rising, plan your baking pans. You may need to get creative! I like to use 12x18" cookie sheets with a lip, and large buns will fill two of these (3 across and 5 down). Or make them half this size (6 across x 10 down) for dainty buns.

12. Grease the baking pans and sprinkle with spice mixture.

13. Shape dough into smooth balls. Arrange in straight rows on the pans. Let rest ~10 min until dough relaxes, then flatten slightly with palm of hand. Let rise another  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour.

14. Set oven to  $375^{\circ}$ F. Make egg wash (reserved egg plus 1 ½ Tbsp water). Immediately before baking, press ½ way thru each bun with a spatula to form a cross. Brush with egg wash, let dough recover, and place in hot oven.

15. While buns are baking, make glaze by heating honey, butter and cinnamon together, brushing buns immediately after removing from oven.

16. Once cool, you may want to add either cream cheese/honey mixture OR a simple white icing to highlight the crosses. Enjoy with hard cooked eggs for Easter breakfast!
